What you have in your hand is the definitive quide to nearly 100 individually organised events. As usual, we have been particularly keen to encourage local talent but as you can see, some big names from further afield have also been drawn to the city.

### How it works

The brochure works in two ways. Detailed event information is arranged by genre on pages 4 to 23 but you can also search using a dayby-day calendar on pages 24 to 29. For recurring events you'll need to flip back to the first mention to find a full description.

In parallel with the main festival is the Chichester Fringe (see ad on p31). Also, please be aware that the Festival of Chichester is not the same as the Chichester Festival Theatre (CFT) which has a summer season of its own (see ad on p9).

Note that while most of the venues are within the city, some (marked  $\blacksquare$ ) are out of town so do read carefully and make sure you know where you are booking. Events marked δ are outdoors so go prepared. Those marked & allow audience members to arrive around 90 minutes early and to bring a picnic.

A large majority of events are ticketed through the Novium/ Chichester Box Office but a handful of organisers have chosen not to use this service so please be aware that the box office can't always sell tickets for every show.

# **GETTING**

### CAR:

Chichester offers excellent car parking facilities. The biggest and least expensive car parks (costing under £1 per hour) are the Northgate CP (beside the Festival Theatre, payable till 8pm, no height restriction), plus the triple-deck

Avenue de Chartres CP (near the station), the Cattle Market CP (southeast of centre) and the smaller Westgate CP (just west of centre) - the latter three are all free after 6pm (or after 5pm on Sundays). Parking right in the centre costs around double. See chichester.gov.uk/carparks for full details.






