INTRODUCTION

WELCOME TO THE 2024 FESTIVAL OF CHICHESTER: FIVE FABULOUS WEEKS OF FUN AND LEARNING ACROSS THE COMMUNITY, FROM PLAYS TO TALKS, FROM MUSIC TO WALKS, FROM ART TO ALL KINDS OF SUMMER ENTERTAINMENT.

What you have in your hand is the definitive guide to around 100 individually organised events. As usual, we have been particularly keen to encourage local talent but, as you can see, some big names from further afield have also been drawn to the city.

How it works

The brochure works in two ways. Detailed event information is arranged by genre on pages 4 to 25 - each with a colour-coded event number. You can also search using a day-by-day calendar on pages 28 to 33. For recurring events you'll need to flip back to the first mention to find a full description.

Please be aware that the Festival of Chichester is not the same as the Chichester Festival Theatre (CFT, see advertisement p33). And though sharing some personnel, the Chichester Fringe (p7) is separate from the main Festival, the last event of its 16-day run coinciding with the first day of the Festival of Chichester.

Note that while most of the venues are within the city, some (marked are out of town, so do read carefully and make sure you know where you are booking. Walks, as well as events marked , are outdoors so check the weather forecast and go prepared.

A large majority of events are ticketed through The Novium/
Chichester Box Office, but a handful of organisers have chosen not to use this service, so please be aware that the box office can't always sell tickets for every show. Shows marked free you can just drop into. Those marked are free but require a ticket due to limited availability. Some free events accept charitable donations.

GETTING

CAR:

Chichester offers excellent car parking facilities. The biggest and least expensive car parks (costing around £1 per hour) are the Northgate CP (beside the Festival Theatre, payable till 8pm, no height restriction), plus the triple-deck Avenue de Chartres CP (near the station), the Cattle Market CP (southeast of centre) and the smaller Westgate CP (just west of centre) - the latter three are all free after 6pm (or after 5pm on Sundays). Parking right in the centre costs around double but most is also free after 6pm. See chichester.gov.uk/carparks for full details.

TRAIN-

The Cathedral is less than a ten minute walk north from the station. According to timetables that were current as we went to press the last rail services Mon-Sat include:

Brighton via Worthing 22.49, 23.11 Portsmouth 22.57, 23.15 **Southampton** 21.27, 22.07 **Littlehampton** 23.24, 23.57

London Victoria via Gatwick 22.01.22.40. or Waterloo via Havant 22.07

Sunday trains generally stop earlier and are often subject to bus-replacements.

BUS:

The last services that leave Chichester include: #60 to Midhurst (from cathedral stop C2) at 20.48 and 22.18 Mon-Sat (17.51 Sun & bank hols) #700 to **Bognor** (Cathedral stop P) at 23.34 and 24.04 (20.54 and 21.24 Sun & bank hols)


